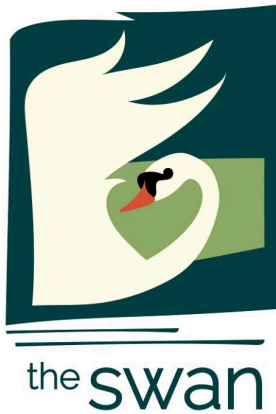
Book Club is back
